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MEET CHARLEE FRASER

SSS Newest Scoliosis Ambasador

Charlee Fraser is an Indigenous Australian international supermodel that has scoliosis. Charlee has walked the catwalk for some of the most famous designers and graced the covers of Vogue, Harper's Bazaar, Marie Claire and many more. She has represented and starred in several major designer cosmetic, eyewear and designer clothing ad campaigns. SSS had the pleasure of interviewing Charlee about her scoliosis.

How old were you when you were diagnosed with Adolescent **Idiopathic Scoliosis?**

I recognized my scoliosis around the age of 14 and was diagnosed shortly after by my family doctor. At the time of diagnosis, my doctor did not suggest a brace nor surgery but rather exercise such as swimming and yoga to help as a preventative.

How did you find out about spinal fusion surgery?

I later learned about spinal fusion surgery through a fellow model during a fashion show who had also suffered from scoliosis and had successful fusion surgery.

What type of surgery did you have?

I had a 40 degree right thoracic curve with right rotation and underwent posterior spinal fusion surgery of which two rods and seventeen screws were utilized to correct my spinal deformity.
